# PATRIOTS' DAY INITIATIVE

Patriots' Day 2021

In April, Wolcott celebrated Patriots' Day with a small in person and LIVE streamed ceremony at the American Legion Hall Post 165. The event was a wonderful way to involve youth and honor two local veterans: Edgar R. Sanchez Sr. and Peter Grasso. Patriots' Day, not to be confused with Patriot Day for the observance of 9/11 heroes, was established to honor our American History and the initial Battles of the American Revolution. Its origins are rooted in history and make their way back to 1894 when the Lexington Historical Society petitioned the State Legislature to proclaim April 19th as "Lexington Day" and then Concord countered with "Concord Day". Governor Frederic T. Greenhalge opted for a compromise to observe, Patriots' Day. However, the biggest battle fought on this day was in the town of Menotomy (mi-naa-ti-mee), now Arlington Massachusetts. Menotomy was on the Concord Road between Lexington, Concord and Boston. While the fighting was going on in Lexington and Concord, five thousand-one hundred militiamen arrived in Menotomy from Middlesex and Essex Counties. These men took up positions along the road the British troops would take on their retreat to Boston. They placed themselves in and around houses, stone walls, fields and barns. The bloodiest fighting of the first day of the American Revolution took place inside a single house, the Jason Russell House, in Menotomy. Sadly, eleven militiamen died inside this house fighting British troops who had been trained in bayonet fighting.

Patriots' Day was first proclaimed in Massachusetts in 1894 by Gov. Greenhalge, replacing "Fast Day" as a public holiday. The idea was introduced to the Governor by a statesman from Lowell named Isaac Henry Paige. It was established on April 19th, commemorating the date of the Battles of Lexington and Concord and the larger Battle of Menotomy in 1775, and consolidating the longstanding municipal observances of Lexington Day and Concord Day. It also marked the first bloodshed of the American Civil War in the Baltimore Riot of 1861. Which during this time, four members of the Massachusetts militia were slain and 36 injured. In Menotomy, now Arlington, twenty-five militiamen died and forty British soldiers were killed. The dual commemoration, Greenhalge explained, celebrated "the anniversary of the birth of liberty and union". It is likely that the battles that took place in Menotomy are not as well known as the smaller battles in Lexington and Concord because the town has had several names since that day in 1775. In 1938, with the generation that had fought in the Civil War largely off the voter rolls, the Massachusetts legislature passed a bill establishing the holiday "in commemoration of the opening events of the War of the Revolution".

Maine followed Massachusetts in 1907 and replaced its "Fast Day" with "Patriots' Day." On July 10, 2017, after the hard work and dedication of Rep. Rob Sampson and other local supporters, Governor Dannel Malloy signed Bill #1022 establishing Patriots' Day as a statewide (unpaid) holiday in Connecticut. On April 16, 2018 Connecticut joined Maine, Massachusetts, and Wisconsin and became the 4th state to recognize the holiday. Since Connecticut's 2018 observance the state of North Dakota has joined the list to celebrate officially; along with Florida residents who also encourage citizens to celebrate but have not yet made it official. Ultimately, the hope is for all states to follow suit and start their own commemorative Patriots' Day celebrations. # The Future of Elections in CT

State Senator Rob Sampson — 16th District



Democrats, fueled by a big election win in 2020 that reversed the decade long trend of incremental Republican gains in the state house and senate, are poised to pass into law a massive list of progressive agenda items.

One issue that has not escaped them is big changes to how we conduct our election process in the Constitution State. Democrats in Connecticut -

and across the nation - want to expand voting in every conceivable way. They are advocating for allowing criminals to vote, reducing the voting age to 16, radically expanding mail-in voting, blockchain technology that will lead to online voting, and even fines for not casting your ballot!

Despite legitimate and factual concerns and documented problems with elections in numerous states, they have willing participants in the news media and have done an incredible job at discrediting, smearing, and cancelling anyone who dares utter the words “voter fraud” as just another “Trumper” perpetuating the “big lie” that the 2021 Presidential election was stolen. A disturbing consequence of our current political climate is just how easy it has become for them to conceal real policy concerns and mischaracterize opposing views by framing an entire issue as toxic based on some minimal association with former President Trump.

The truth about the upcoming constitutional amendments to our Connecticut state constitution is of course, much more complex.

Right now, they are laser focused on using their huge majorities to lock in the most expansive changes by amending our state constitution.

There are currently two major changes proposed to enable the following:

**1. A Constitutional Amendment To Enact Early Voting**

Democrats want to enact a Constitutional change that removes the current requirement for one day of in-person voting to instead allow an unspecified and unlimited number of “early voting” days ahead of any election – leaving the currently Democratically controlled legislature to fill in the details. No photo identification would be required and there will remain no audits of absentee balloting or votes cast by those using election day registration. No additional funds are set aside for towns to accommodate staffing multi-day polling locations or the numerous other costs that will ultimately be passed on to local property taxpayers.

As the Ranking Member of the legislative committee that covers election law – and effectively the voice of the minority Republican party on the subject, I worked hard to find common ground with my colleagues and offered support for their early voting constitutional amendment - if they were also willing to compromise. On March 5, 2021, I offered an amendment that would establish a period for early voting of three days within five days, enabling a Sun, Mon, Tues election, or Sat, Mon, Tues, or even Fri, Mon, Tues. My amendment would also require that we enact a requirement that voting at the polls in person requires a photo id – something I know most people who live in well run small towns think is already the law – but definitely is not. Unfortunately, my proposal failed on a party line vote.

**2. A Constitutional Amendment To Allow For “No Excuse” Absentee Ballot Voting**

They also want to expand our current absentee voting process that allows for absentee ballots to be cast during the 45 days preceding election day because of absence from the city or town of which they are inhabitants or because of sickness, or physical disability or because the

tenets of their religion forbid secular activity – as well as being away because of military service. Under their revisions, anyone would be able to vote by mail-in ballot for any reason whatsoever.

That would certainly make voting more convenient but here again, the details are what matter. Across the country, in states where they have similar provisions, state governments have also invested heavily in making sure that this process would be secure. Photo ID, signature verification, audits, and ensuring the chain of custody of ballots are the norm. Connecticut has NONE of these requirements. Ballot harvesting by political candidates and their allies would be the norm in every community, not just our major cities.

Here again, I tried my best to find common ground with the majority. At the same meeting I reference above, I offered support for amending our constitution to allow for no-excuse absentee voting as long as they pledged that we would include a signature verification system like those found in other states. Once again, they refused and voted down my compromise on party lines.

Today, it is almost certain these two significant constitutional changes will pass our legislature with little fanfare. The next step is that they will be voted on by you in the form of ballot questions. It’s worth noting the Democrat majority will be writing the ballot questions also and you can be sure they will not include the details above. They will be simplified to the point of asking if someone wants “free lunch.” A question likely to receive a very positive result until we start specifying exactly what lunch consists of.

I will remain resolute in my job as the Republican Senator charged with being the minority voice on the committee that oversees changes to Connecticut's election laws and administration. There must be proper considerations made and precautions taken as we look to make sweeping changes to state election laws. I will fight to make sure we have them.





## 5 Dental Myths, Debunked

When it comes to taking care of your smile, there are plenty of misconceptions about what it takes to keep your teeth healthy. But while good oral health can be achieved in just minutes a day, the wrong practices can cause irreversible damage. Here's what you need to know.

**Myth: The harder you brush, the cleaner you'll get your teeth.**

The real deal: Brushing too hard or with too abrasive of a toothbrush (medium or firm) can actually harm your teeth by eroding some of the hard enamel that protects the inside of the tooth from cavities and decay. Brushing too hard actually wears away the enamel and also the gums. A soft-bristled brush is always recommended.

**Myth: Flossing isn't really necessary anymore.**

The real deal: The recommendation to floss regularly was recently removed from the government's Dietary Guidelines for Americans based on a lack of strong evidence for the practice. However, a lack of strong evidence doesn't mean that flossing is not effective. Most dentists haven't changed their recommendations: if there is buildup you can only remove it by flossing daily.

**Myth: Chewing sugar-free gum is just as good as brushing.**

The real deal: If only this were true. Chewing sugar-free gum, especially with xylitol, can have a protective effect on the teeth. Gum encourages saliva production, which helps to wash away enamel-eroding acids from foods, drinks, and even stomach acid. Xylitol helps to redouble the effects of saliva. Chewing gum still doesn't replace brushing/ flossing when it comes to removing plaque from all the surfaces of your teeth. You should brush at least twice a day for about two minutes.

**Myth: If your gums bleed when you floss, it's best to leave them alone.**

The real deal: The reason our gums bleed is due to inflammation. Often it happens that bacteria and plaque get stuck in between our teeth where toothbrush bristles don't reach properly. Over time the bacteria builds up causing the gums to become inflamed. Bleeding is part of that process.

If you only floss once a month (or just before going to the dentist), it's likely you'll notice your gums bleeding. That's a sign telling you something is going on. Make flossing a daily habit and the inflammation/ bleeding will go away with time.

**Myth: You've been slacking on brushing and flossing and have a dentist appointment coming up. As long as you brush well before going in, no one will know, right?**

The real deal: Sorry to break it to you, but you're not getting away with anything. Your hygienist can tell. Without regular brushing/flossing, hard tartar forms around your teeth that can't come off with brushing alone. Plus, you can't undo the inflammation in your gums that occurs when plaque / tartar has accumulated over six months with just a few days of flossing. Bleeding gums, the amount and location of tartar are the giveaways.

Going for regular dental check-ups can prevent things from happening to your teeth before they become an issue...

# Wolcott Historical Society - May 2021

In this month's article I would like to continue our ride back in time from the early to the mid-1900s of the Hitchcock Lake area. We pick up our tour at the corner of East Street and Meriden Road. George's Cleaners, owned by George Plantier, was located on the western side of East Street along with Tony's Barber Shop and a Pizza establishment. Carl Mattesen's Surveying Company was across East Street where the transmitter towers are located. The Matteson name is found on many survey maps of Wolcott. If you continued to travel down Southington Mountain Roger's Orchard was located on the

right side of Meriden Road midway down the mountain and it is still there today. Now let's travel back up the hill and turn onto East Street to find out what else Hitchcock Lake had to offer in those early years.

If you drive to the end of Grove Avenue you will reach Grove Beach. It is located on the first lake or the south section of the lake and was established in 1945. In those early years, the lake was weed infested and many members spent hours trying to keep the lake clean; of course this was pre chemical times. Next to Grove Beach was Alma Avenue Beach and the French Colony. This property was called the French Colony because the early residents came to the area from the Fort Kent, Maine during the 1930s and 1940s to work in the factories in Waterbury.

Further on down East Street was Bethal Lane. In this area you would have found the Bethal Lane Amusement Park and Dance Hall also known as Morris Park. Many Waterbury residents would trolley out to the Park for a day of fun. It had shooting games and vaudeville entertainment. There were rental facilities for boats and fishing equipment. Another store in the area sold candy and cold drinks for all to enjoy. People could spend the day fishing and picnicking on the lake.

On the corner of East Street and Maple Lane was Theriault's Ice House. In the rear of this corner house a deep hole was dug and lined with straw and hay. The ice was cut from the lake and dragged up the road, buried and preserved for summer use. Many residents purchased blocks of ice for their "ice boxes". Later this became Theriault's Oil.

Across the street was Chase Country Club, a nine-hole golf course built by the Chase Manufacturing Company of Waterbury for their employees. There was a picnic and outing area to the rear of the parking lot. It was a popular gathering place in the 1930s through the 1960s. Later it was renamed Farmingbury Hills Country Club. Today it is called Farmingbury Hills and owned by the Town of Wolcott and serves as a public 9-hole golf course.

Further down East Street was Hemingway Avenue. On the corner of Hemingway Avenue and East Street was the Morris Park Hotel, which was owned by Morris Hemingway. As you drove up the hill on Hemingway Avenue on the left-hand side you would see the B.S.A. Summer Camp. It consisted of several wooden barrack structures similar to Camp Mattatuck. When you reached the end of the road you would find Doctor Mayo's summer cottage, which was located on the lake. Every 4th of July the doctor would have a huge fireworks display that could be enjoyed by everyone on the lake. Local youths were provided with hot dogs and sodas during the celebration.


Returning to East Street and heading back toward Meriden Road if you turned onto Central Avenue and headed down

toward the lake you would come upon Kerwin's General Store and Gift Shop. Each neighborhood had a small local store to furnish their household needs and this was one of several located in the area. This long red barn-type building is still used today as a private residence owned by Joan Polowitz who has been a great help with information for

this article. Originally this barn was part of Samuelson's Farm, but eventually the farm was divided into building lots. In many cases Mrs. Samuelson would hold the mortgage and this served as her monthly income. Just beyond the red barn was Company I Fire Department. It was the first Fire Company to be established in our town in 1934 and called the Hitchcock Lake Fire Department. Across from Company I Fire Department the Fair Grounds were found. In the 1950s, the Fair would come to this area yearly. It would have a Ferris wheel, rides, cotton candy, shooting galleries and much more.

The Hitchcock Lake area was thriving in so many ways in those early years because of its easy access to residents from surrounding towns. The Green Line Trolley served as the main source of transportation for them. Next month I'll finish my tour of this much loved Hitchcock Lake area.

All 10th grade students, from both the Civics classes and AP U.S. Government and Politics classes, were given the opportunity to create and submit questions that would potentially be asked during the conversation with Representative Hayes. We had an overwhelming response, with over 60 students submitting approximately 80 different questions. These covered many topics including how Representative Hayes came to run for Congress, what the day to day of the job is like, and of course, many political issues that the students were interested in.

A smaller group of students volunteered to meet with Congresswoman Hayes and ask some of the questions that had been submitted by their peers. The Congresswoman, having previously been a Social Studies teacher herself, was thrilled to meet with our students, talk about her time in office, and provide more insight into our democratic system.

Our students were able to learn a great deal from the experience and can now say that they've (virtually) met their representative. We're so proud of our students for all their hard work and can't wait to provide more opportunities like this in the future!



# Wolcott Board of Education

**Please remember that staffing and public health issues can cause our schedules to change with little notice.**

COVID-19 is spread mainly via person-to-person contact through contaminated air droplets from coughing and sneezing by an infected person. As with controlling the spread of other viruses, we urge everyone to discuss the following preventive measures with your children and family members:

- Wash your hands frequently, but especially after using the restroom and before preparing or consuming food. Using soap and hot water, wash for about 20 seconds. Be sure to also wash your fingertips. When soap and water are not available, use hand sanitizer.
- Avoid coughing or sneezing into your hands or in the air. Always try to cough or sneeze into a tissue, then throw the tissue away. If you don't have a tissue, cough/sneeze inside the elbow of your arm.

- As much as you can, avoid touching your eyes, mouth, and nose.
- Wear a face covering (mask) whenever there is a likelihood that you or your family members will be in the presence of others.
- Maintain social distancing (at least 6 feet) between yourself and others when outside of your home.
- Be mindful and watch for the symptoms of COVID-19 in yourself and family members:
  - Fever (100.4° Fahrenheit or higher)
  - Chills or shaking chills
  - Uncontrolled new cough (not due to other known cause, such as chronic cough)
  - Difficulty breathing or shortness of breath
  - New loss of taste or smell
