

# A Look Ahead to 2023



## State Senator Rob Sampson 16th District

**E**lection 2022 is now behind us. Thank you to voters of the 16th Senate district for putting their trust and confidence in me for another term. You can count on me to keep my promises and my

commitment to honor and defend this great country and to work every day to rebuild our beloved State of Connecticut.

I am looking forward to enjoying the holidays while also preparing for the next legislative session which begins in January. As in previous years, I plan to submit quite a few bill proposals focused on correcting our course as a state government and addressing the issues that matter most to you.

**Affordability** - Everyday expenses remain at all-time highs. The legislature will be going into session to extend the state's gas tax holiday — a Republican idea — before it expires at the end of 2022. I will obviously support whatever tax relief I can find for us, though we need much more than tax holidays. We need permanent relief and a focus on reducing spending and taxes across state government.

Whether in a special session or the 2023 regular session, I will push those on the other side of the aisle to eliminate the arbitrary, unfair "highway use fee" on commercial trucks that takes effect in 2023. This fee is just another tax on companies who sell goods and services in Connecticut—thus further driving up the cost of any product or service delivered by commercial vehicle.

Beyond this immediate need, I will again introduce measures that eliminate a multitude of unfair and burdensome taxes like those on Social Security, pension, and annuity income. Some taxes even cost our state agencies more to

collect than revenue that is created. At last count, the state imposes hundreds of different taxes and fees on residents. Only a government that has grown far too large could sustain such a practice.

Public safety is perhaps government's most basic function. The rise in crime is very much on the minds of families across the state — despite creative statistics deployed prior to the election attempting to confuse the issue. As in the past, my priority is policy that will improve our quality of life and keep our families safe.

One such measure will be to repeal the damaging policy contained within the "Police Accountability Bill" that placed harmful and ill-conceived restrictions on law enforcement and have contributed to the current crime wave. Another part of this bill subjects towns to frivolous lawsuits — which further encumber that town's law enforcement. This must also be eliminated.

I will also seek to repeal or amend recent laws that have diminished the consequences for violent criminal offenses. The "risk reduction" credit program for reduced sentences is one such measure. Laws such as this only further incentivize criminal activity.

For years, the far left has continued to push for more gun control by deceptively attempting to connect private gun ownership and criminal activity. All evidence, and common sense, says otherwise. Law-abiding citizens have the right to defend themselves against criminals seeking to do harm. That is more obvious now than ever. At the capitol, I continue to defend this right, and all our natural rights protected by our country's founding documents.

**Individual Freedom** - A key difference between the political parties is a disagreement simply on how much government we should have. When it comes to growing our economy and choosing how money is spent, I will trust "the people" over "the state" every time. That is even more true on issues of individual liberty. It is important that we do not forget

the business shutdowns and punitive healthcare mandates that cost jobs, careers, and businesses, some even their life's savings, and in some cases much worse, the inability to connect with loved ones, the mental health of our society - particular children, even a dramatic increase in suicides.

As free citizens, we should never allow this governmental overreach again. I will continue to stand for individual freedom and personal choice. Ultimately, we must maintain the people's voice even when dealing with an emergency.

**Accountability & Transparency** - A government that has become too large, by nature, lacks transparency. There are simply too many layers and too many "officials" that dilute their accountability to you. I serve as the Ranking Republican on the Government Administration and Elections committee and I remain committed to increasing transparency across government, in public schools, and elections.

This has been for good reason. We've seen documented accounts of how, when the public is in the dark, a large government seeks to serve its own interests. In the classroom, I will continue to push legislation that lets parents know what their kids are being taught in school, and how those who teach them have been trained to do so. I want to empower teachers also and protect them from getting caught up in politics that has no place in public education. At the ballot box, I'll continue to advocate for improving the integrity of our elections.

These priorities are a high-level view of my goals in 2023 as your state senator. I will also propose bills that improve our economic outlook and environmental policy, reduce fuel and energy costs, combat human trafficking, and restore representative government. I encourage you to continue to hold all your elected officials accountable because we ultimately work for you. I hold this perspective in every vote that I cast, or bill that I introduce. May you all have a healthy, safe, and joyful holiday season.

## Wolcott Volunteer Ambulance News

### Happy Holidays!

We would like to wish all of you a safe and joyous holiday season! Thank you all for your continued support of WVAA.

### Ambulance Transportation

We often receive requests for ambulance transportation to hospitals outside of our area such as Hartford, Connecticut Children's Medical Center, or Yale. We understand there are many reasons why our patients request these facilities and truly wish we were able to take every patient to their requested destination. The fact of the matter is we operate under regulations set for by the Connecticut Department of Health which requires each ambulance service to align with a sponsor hospital for medical oversight. Since 1987, Wolcott Ambulance has been affiliated with Saint Mary's Hospital and we operate under Dr. Wes Kyle (a former volunteer EMT of WVAA!). We are bound by medical protocols from the Department of Health and Saint Mary's Hospital which include directions on where we can transport our patients based on several factors including how sick or injured they are at the time of transport.

Occasionally we will be able to accommodate our patient's request for transport to an out of area hospital based on these protocols as well as the resources that we have available at the time of the request. If the patient's condition meets the protocol, and we have enough ambulances and personnel to cover the rest of the calls for help in town we would be happy to transport them to an out of area hospital.

We truly try to accommodate every patient's hospital request. We thank you for your understanding when we are unable to grant that request and suggest a closer facility. We encourage anyone that has additional questions regarding this to contact us.

### Ambulance Facility Update

As you travel on Woodtick Road, you may have noticed some changes at 1300! The lights are on, and we are working hard to bring new life to the former Saint Maria Goretti Church. We put up a temporary sign in November and are cleaning the interior as our architects put the finishing touches on the plans so we can begin construction.

Please remember to use the 48 Todd Road location for all unscheduled or emergent visits until further notice.

The news that 3 Bristol Police Officers were ambushed and shot, killing Lieutenant Dustin Demonte and Sergeant Alex Hamzy, and wounding Officer Alec Iurato brought most of us to tears. We were all shocked that something so hateful and cruel could happen so close to home.

They had passed the Touchdown Jar around the stands after each touchdown they scored all season. They also collected donations from friends and family. Wolcott businesses, family, friends, and social media contacts pledged to donate for each touchdown the boys scored.

On October 23rd, the U6 team, all 5 & 6 year olds, proudly took the field adorning their blue jerseys, they scored 4 touchdowns. Wolcott's local business: J&J Automotive Customs, Happy Hands Prep, and DB Landscape all donated to the cause. In the end, those

boys and their families raised \$1250. On November 3rd, the team met and presented the Bristol Police Department with their donation.

Now that elections are behind us, I wanted to say thank you to all the voters in Wolcott and Southington for re-electing me to serve as your State Representative. I am honored once again to be given this opportunity to represent you and I appreciate your confidence and the trust you have in me.

At the Capitol in Hartford, we are preparing to convene for the 2023 legislative session on January 4th. Over the course of the next few weeks, I will work on submitting legislation aimed at improving our state, restoring common sense, and making it a more competitive and affordable place to live and conduct business in. Your concerns about government matter to me, and as we enter a new legislative session in January, I encourage you to reach out to me about those issues.

Voters have also spoken when it comes to "early voting" and though I didn't agree with it, I will certainly respect the will of the people and work with my colleagues to come up with a solution as to how exactly it will work.

The question put before voters asked whether residents wanted "early" voting, but the details of what that would look like were left to the legislature. As ranking member of the Governmental Administration and Elections Committee, I will be actively involved in the process of shaping and defining what constitutes "early." My fellow lawmakers and I will determine how many hours,

weeks or days voters will have before Election Day to cast their ballots. How much time is enough will be up for debate. As we resolve what that process will look like, we also need to ensure that the integrity of our electoral system is maintained. With that said I will be pushing for in person voter ID requirements and signature verification on absentee ballots.

We also have no way of knowing how much it will cost to keep polls open for a longer period and to pay people to staff them. In Massachusetts, keeping the polls open for only three additional hours cost taxpayers \$2 million this year. How much will it cost Connecticut to do the same? Towns may have to foot the bill for "early" voting, so this will become another unfunded state mandate.

But life isn't all about politics, so as we approach the holidays, I hope it reminds us that despite the ongoing political debate the bonds of family, community and country are still deep and lasting. This is the season for sharing good will, helping those in need, and celebrations with friends, family, and co-workers. It is a special time for our children and a time to remember our own childhoods. I hope all your gatherings are safe, warm, and filled with joy. Merry Christmas and Happy Hanukkah to all!

# Wolcott Historical Society - December 2022

This month I'm going to revisit a series of articles that I wrote about back in 2017 about small planes that came down in our town. The idea to research these stories came about from a Facebook post that I was following at the time. There are several "Wolcott" groups on Face Book but depending on the topic and one's point of view or "memory" the comments might be fact or fiction. In January of 2017 on "Wolcott Chats" Jerry O'Neill posted a question looking for information about a WWII plane that was located on someone's lawn in Wolcott many years ago. His question received a wealth of responses and caused me to start searching my files for information on when and where planes had either crashed or been placed in town over the years. What I found was quite interesting so once again I will share my findings with you over the next few months.

My search through 1930s and 1940s old newspaper articles enlightened me about two different planes that ended up in local lakes. This jarred my memory and I thought about an old airstrip right here in our town so that's where I decided to start.





Did you know that in the early 1930s up on Spindle Hill in the western section of town there was an airfield? There actually was and it included a hanger and air sock. This airstrip was found on the pastureland of the 149-acre farm owned by John Churchelow. This crude landing strip was the handiwork of air enthusiasts Alexander and Michael

Churchelow and their friend, Joseph Shea of Waterbury. These men cleared the land by hand removing stone walls, brush, rocks and trees and the airstrip became a reality. They flew a single motor propeller driven monoplane and a converted OX3 Parks 2-seater biplane. Alexander Churchelow, who later changed his last name to "Churchill" managed the

Mt. Tobe Airport in Plymouth and taught aviation there. His daughter, Marlene Tosun remembers her dad taking her flying many times and she loved it. One vivid memory was the day her dad took her to Mt. Tobe Airport to watch the first woman parachute from an airplane. During WWII Alexander became an instructor in the Air Force and when the war ended, he began flying commercially. He flew for Northwest Airlines on their Tokyo run. All three men truly enjoyed flying and maintained their pilot's licenses until their deaths. Sadly, all that remains of the airstrip is an overgrown field on Spindle Hill Road next to where the Wolcott Sports Complex is found today.

Chestnut Hill reservoir is in the southwestern section of Wolcott. It is also known as Arrowhead, a name acquired from the arrowheads found there over the years; left behind by the Tunxis Indians while hunting in this region. On Friday, July 31, 1931, a hydroplane from Montauk Point, Long Island was headed to a Waterbury airport when it was forced to make an emergency landing on Chestnut Hill reservoir because of instrument gauge failure. The paper stated that numerous bathers became alarmed as the plane landed in the middle of the lake very close to shore. Two aviators and a passenger on plane came through the ordeal unharmed, but the plane sustained some damage. The pilots explained to witnesses that they were unaware that they were losing altitude because the instrument panel registered 1000 feet when they were at 200 feet. By then it was too late to make adjustments, so they opted for a landing in the reservoir. During the descent the plane grazed several pine trees and opened a hole on its underside, which caused it to submerge soon after landing. The two aviators carried an elderly man out of the plane and

onto the shore where they inquired about how to get transportation back to New York. Harold Curtis, a worker on the Charles Platt farm drove the men to Exchange Place in Waterbury. Before leaving they told Edelbert Reichenbach, the caretaker of the reservoir that they would return on Monday with a mechanic to make repairs to the plane. They also made arrangements with Walter Smith, a local farmer on Chestnut Hill Road to watch the plane for the weekend then

quickly left the scene without disclosing their identity. Monday arrived, but the men and mechanic did not. The hydroplane was moved to the farm of Walter C. Smith where it remained waiting to be claimed by its owner.

The next article that I found about this plane was on October 29, 1931, titled, "Owner of Mysterious Seaplane in Reservoir Is Named in 4 Suits." This article explained that A. E. Archibald, a New York businessman with offices at 26 Broadway was the owner of the plane. Four men from Wolcott and Waterbury were suing Archibald for services and repairs made to his plane. George A. Blanchard was suing for \$250 for services; Walter Smith was suing for \$200 for storage and services; John Kirschbaum was suing for \$38 for services; and Leland Smith was suing for \$78 for services. The men

stated to their attorney Finton J. Phelan that they dragged the plane out of the reservoir and made the necessary repairs to it; they now wanted to be reimbursed for their services. It was also implied that after all was said and done; it was doubtful that the plane could be flown out of the area.

I was unable to find another article about the decision by the courts or how the plane was removed from this location. The January 2023 edition will continue with several other plane stories from Wolcott's past.


